It seems to me a very spiritual work with a great deal of sincerity and atmosphere and (musically speaking) thoroughly sound and interesting.

I consider it would be very enterprising on your part to assist in its production, and though I cannot speak of it from the dramatic standpoint with any authority, I can vouch for its intrinsically musical qualities...."
